Give Something Back (Give Back) is a national nonprofit supporting students who have faced significant adversities, guiding them toward long-term success in a safe and caring community. Since 2003, Give Back has been providing long-term mentoring to high school and college students, as well as scholarships to lessen burdensome student debt. The California Chapter of Give Back was opened in 2017 and focuses entirely on serving youth who have experienced the child welfare system, homelessness, traumatic crimes, the incarceration of a parent, and/or other significant adversities (four or more Adverse Childhood Experiences). CA Give Back provides evidenced-based interventions and support that include long term one-on-one coaching, career exploration, post-secondary planning, independent living skills, and social emotional learning delivered through holistic year-round programming. Eighty-six percent of youth who have joined CA Give Back are persisting in their higher educational plans. CA Give Back follows and assists young adults to career placement and is now hiring alumni to create and deliver programming and provide mentorship and support.

Give Back Academy (GBA) is a school-based mentoring program created by CA Give Back through collaboration and support by San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools. GBA is organized as a club operated during the school day on middle school and high school campuses in five school districts. GBA serves 25 students per school site selected by school staff for their demonstrations of RESILIENCE. GBA Coaches provide monthly workshops on topics including community connections, life skills, character building, and career/educational exploration to help youth prepare for their unique post-secondary path. The GBA curriculum is designed around three trauma-informed, evidence-based core competencies: Economic Stability, Resiliency Building, and Relational Wealth.

Partnering together for change, San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools and Give Back were one of 20 awardees selected by the California Department of Education to receive a two-year Homeless Innovation Program (HIP) grant. Through this grant, CA Give Back is in the process of formalizing our GBA curriculum as a Model Innovation Practice (MIP) Toolkit to be shared with educators throughout the state. 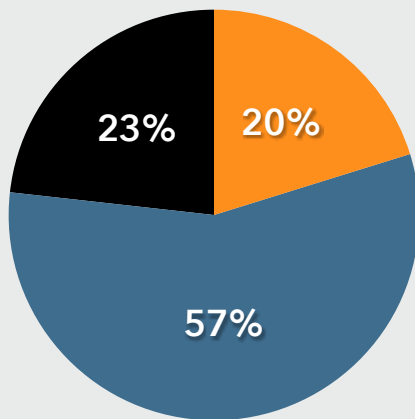

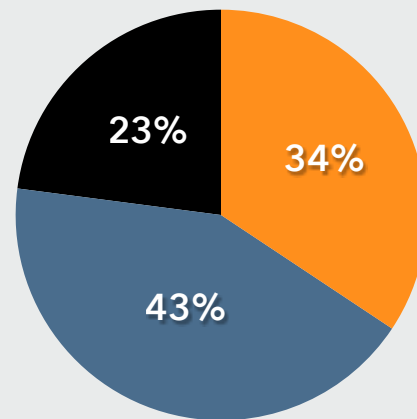

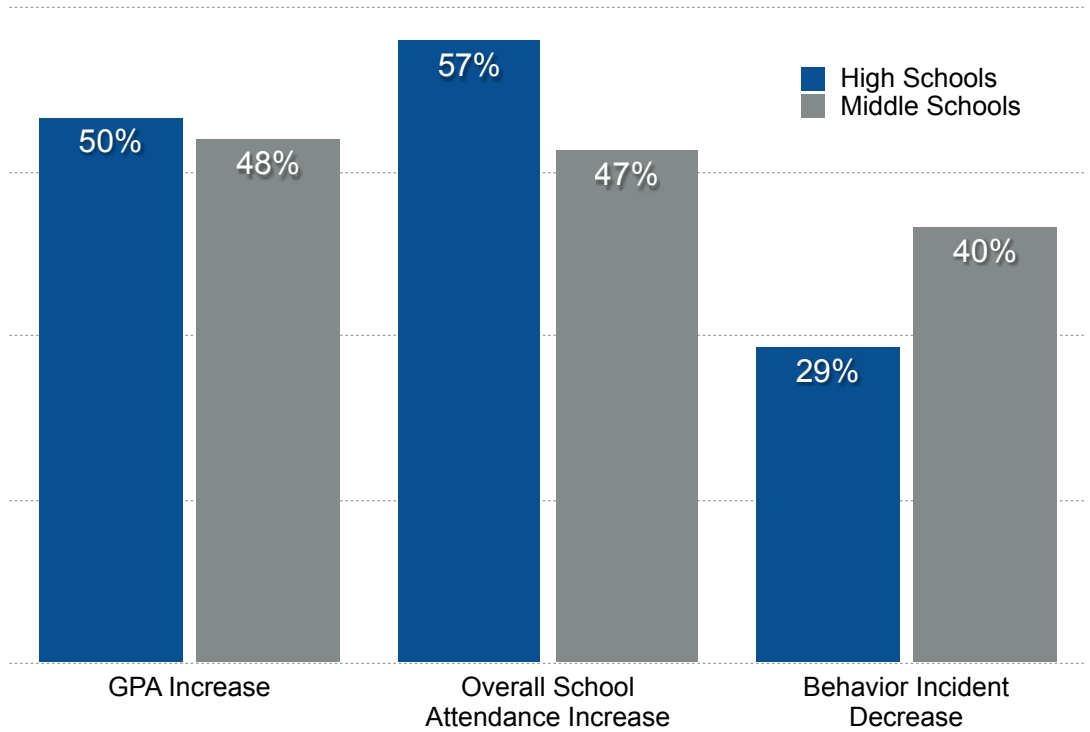

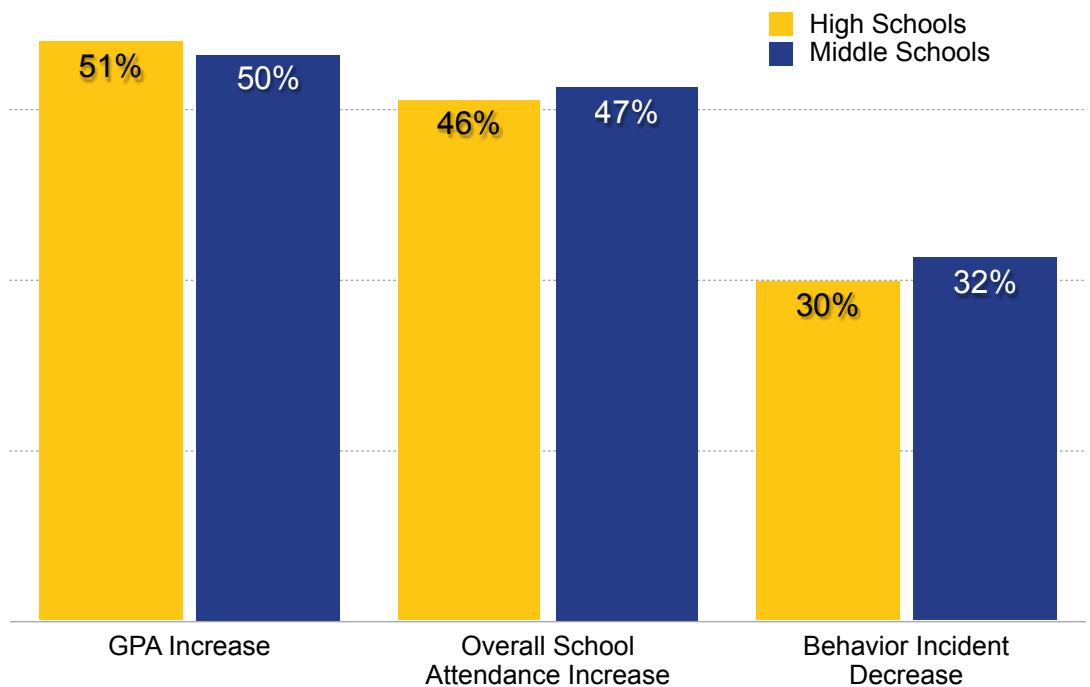
The following data has been gathered from the school districts, illustrating higher GPAs, improved school attendance, and reduced behavior incidents among students who took part in the GBA workshops.

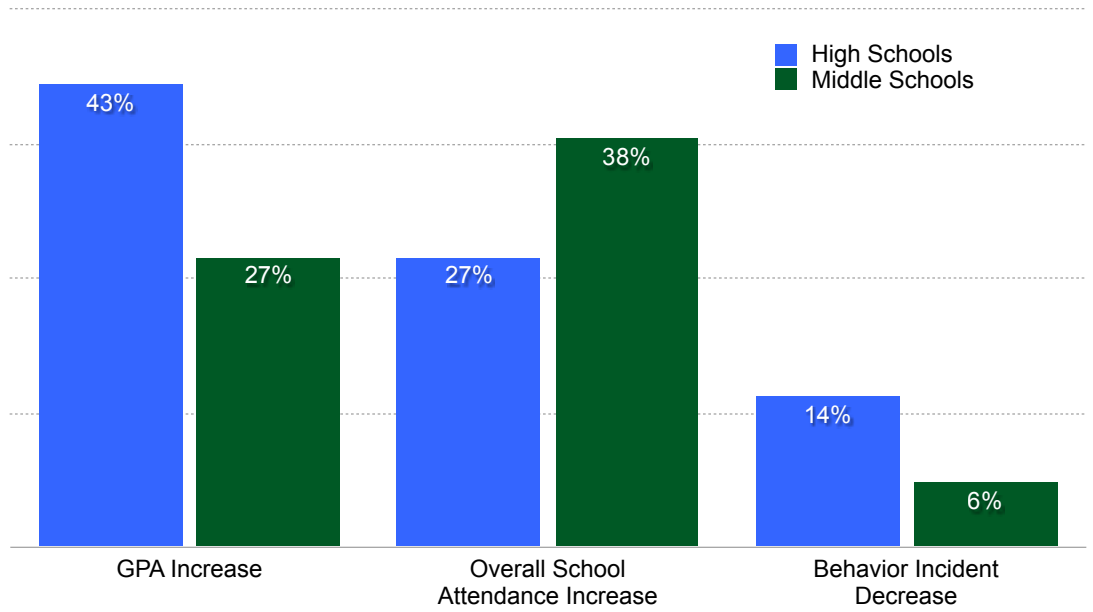

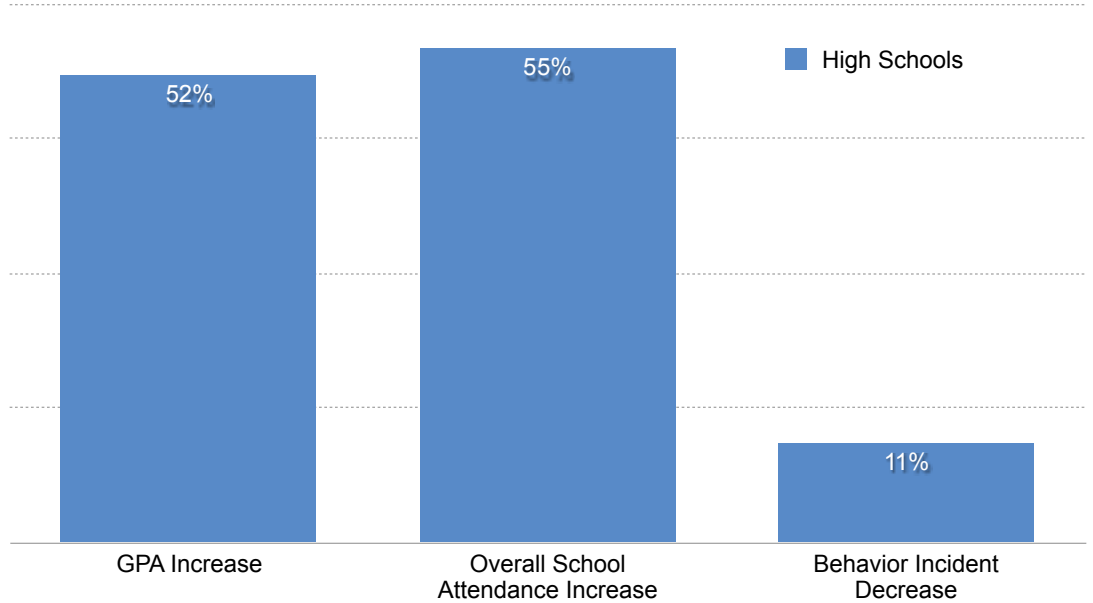

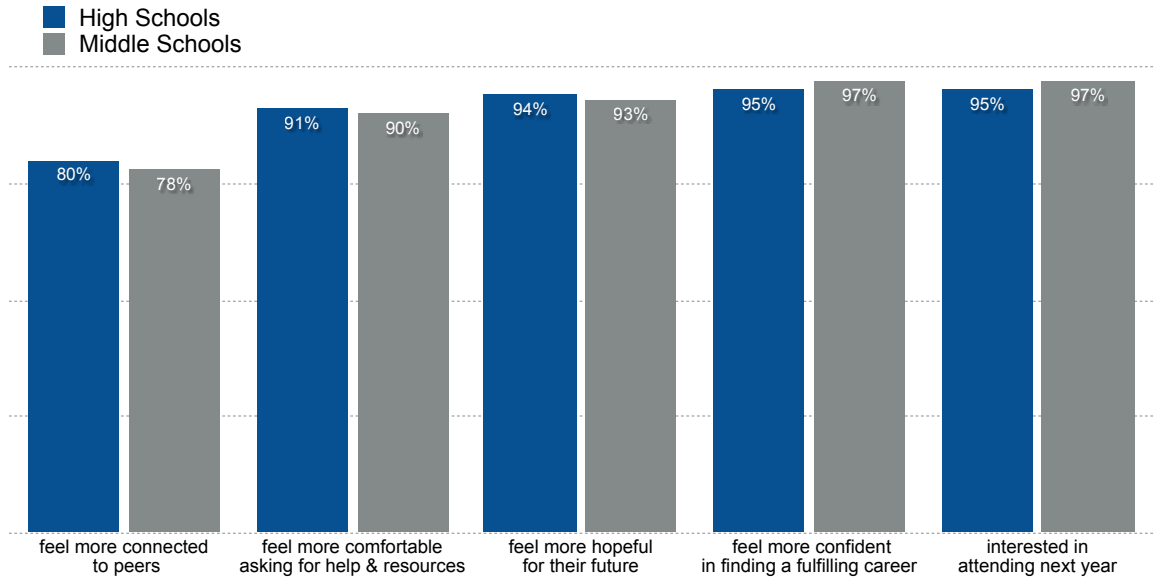
At the end of the year students were invited to participate in a survey that assessed changes in their attitudes about school and perceptions about their future after attending GBA workshops.

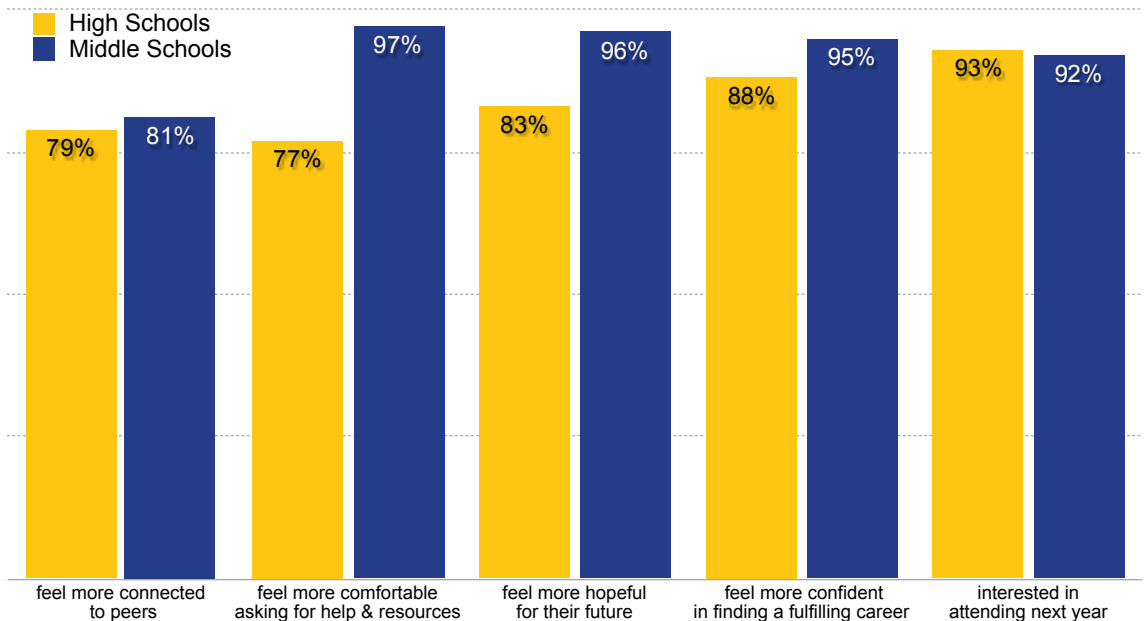

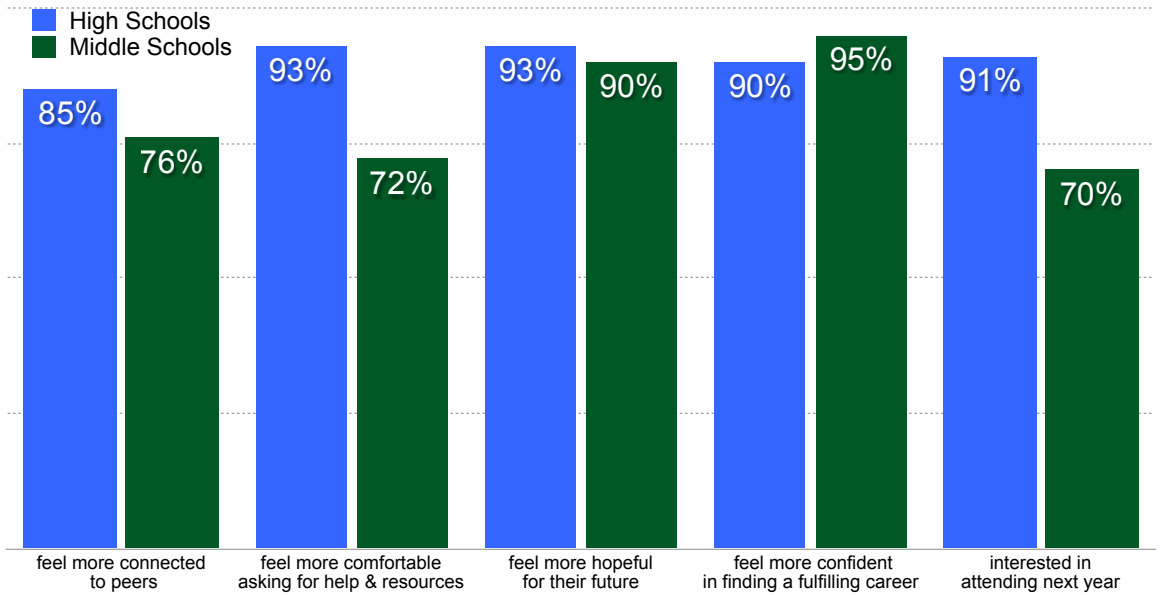

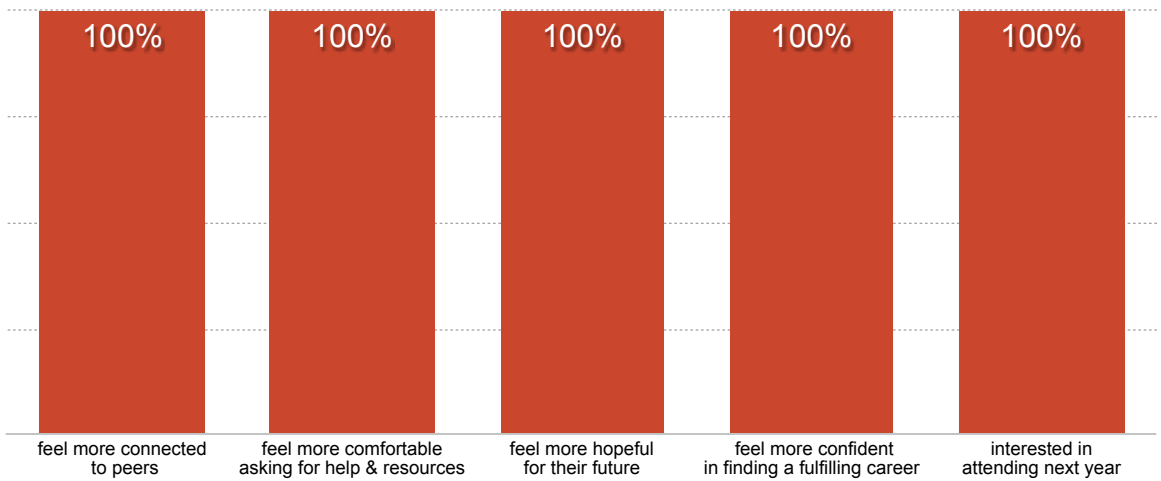

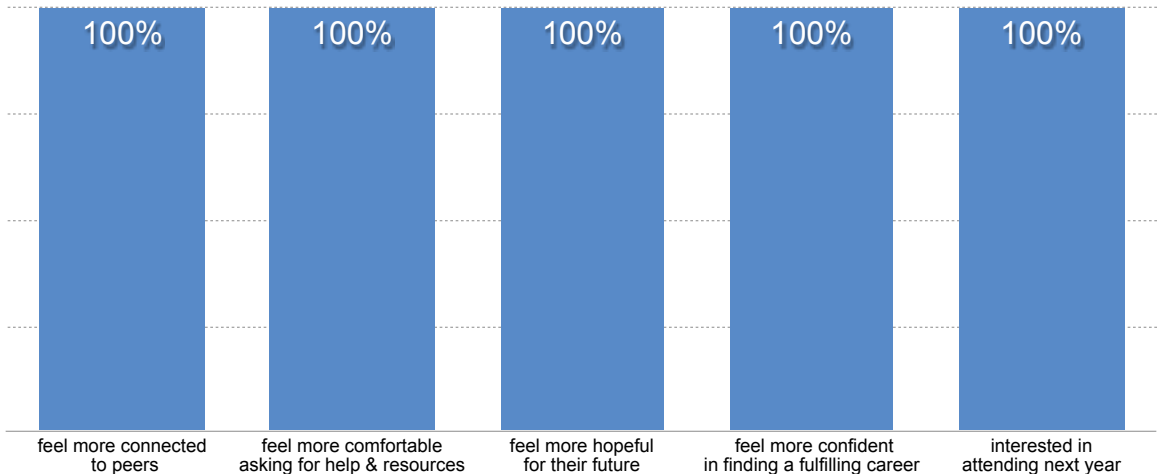
